MEN'S SEEDED TEAMS

#1 John Beck — Bedford Golf & Tennis Club Herb Fitzaibbon — Fire Island Boys Club

The 1973 performance of this team was one of the finest ever in the recent history of the sport. Together they played five sanctioned tournaments, and won all five, including the Big ONE — the MEN'S DOUBLES CHAM-PIONSHIPS at Fox Meadow, N.Y. last March. Herbie is considered by many to have the finest serve in the game to match his forcing game from the "ad court." John is the only ranking lefty to play the "deuce court", which he does with a fury. He is also well known for his superb chop shot, which when combined with his attacking shots is nearly impossible to defend against.

#2 Chauncey Steele, III — The Country Club Boston
Keith Jennings — The Country Club Boston

Clevelanders will long remember this duo's drive towards the NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP in 1973. The team arrived as the twelfth seeded team and their drive fell short only in the fifth set of the finals. Last year they were again runner-up in NATIONALS to Beck & Fitzgibbon, and currently they are ranked third nationally. They have many long suits, but most people consider them the premier volleying team in the nation. Keith ROAMS the Court from "backhand" side, while Chum seldom errs while setting his partner up for the winner.

#3 John Mangan — Manursing Island Club Robert Kingsbury — Fox Meadow Club

This team could well be local Clevelanders favorite team, and I suspect the feeling might well be mutual as John and Bobbie have never lost a match in Cleveland. They have won the two previous Cleveland Invit's as well as the '73 Nationals hosted locally. They are anxious to regain their National Title this year.






MEN'S DRAW - BOTTOM HALF
